



Church Notes

At a meeting of the Church following the morning service last Sunday a letter was granted to Mr. Walter J. Cox, who will unite with the First Methodist Church of this city.

There will be daily noon-day services at the Lyceum Theatre February 6th to 11th inclusive. These meetings, while promoted by the First Methodist Church, are planned in the interest of the whole city. Dr. M. S. Rice will be the speaker at all of the meetings which will begin at a quarter after twelve and close promptly at ten minutes of one. The hearty cooperation of all Christian people is earnestly solicited.

The Misionary Committee met on Friday evening last, to consider the question of benevolences for this year. The apportionment for this Conference has been lowered, by the State Committee, to \$1,500, and the Missionary Committee recommend to Pilgrim Church that we aim to raise of this amount the sum of \$1,300, including in this what the women raise for the Home work. This is just about the amount actually raised last year, but owing to the loss by death of the heaviest giver to this fund, we need a material increase of new givers or of larger gifts on the part of some of those formerly contributing. It would be especially unfortunate for us to have to curtail the amount contributed for the support of Rev. H. M. Irwin, our Foreign Missionary, and of his children.

The Committee accepted the resignation of Mr. W. W. Mc-Millan, named at the Annual Meeting as a member of this Committee, because as Treasurer of the Misionary Fund he is exofficio a member, and elected to fill that vacancy Mr. S. E. Matter. The Committee formally organized by the election of Mr. H. B. Paull as Chairman, and adjourned to meet this morning at the close of the service.

A Tribute

(From the Duluth News Tribune of Monday, March 27th.)

Forty-one years ago Duluth was a straggling village and its hills were covered by a dense pine forest. It had no railroad connection with the outside world and did not have the advantages of water connection with the rest of the state. It was isolated, but ambitious,

It was then that William S. Woodbridge came here with his bride, from Boston; from the center of American culture to all the rigors, hardships and privations of the frontier. He had the pioneer spirit; he had the ability, the enthusiasm, the idealism, the tenacity of purpose, that always conquers, and transforms frontiers to cultural centers.

His history became the history of Duluth and, in no small measure, the history of Duluth became his history. He was prominent in all of its activities, and rode its troubled seas, now on the crest, now in the trough of the waves. He never lost his courage and was always ready to do his share.

Of late years his health kept him away from the city in winters and his business removed him from the whirl of events. But he never lost his interest nor lagged in his in-

The news of his death at Los Angeles, last Friday, was received here through the News Tribune of Saturday. It brought great regret to all who knew him and sorrow to the hearts of those older residents with whom he had been an active co-worker.

Praise of him is unnecessary, as his life tells its own story of honor and accomplishment. But his memory will be cherished in many hearts and Duluth itself is the monument of him and of those with whom he labored to make it, not alone big, but also great.

William Starkweather Woodbridge

Mr. Woodbridge was descended from a long line of earnest, sincere, Godly people. With but one break for eleven generations his forefathers in a direct line bore the name John Woodbridge. With one exception all of these were preachers, and nearly all were dissenting preachers, a strong proof of their scholarly attainments and independence of thought. He was ninth in descent from Governor Dudley, the first governor of Massachusetts Bay Colony, seventh from John Eliot, the apostle to the Indians, and fourth from Jonathan Edwards, the Martin Luther of America. His father was Rev. Jonathan Edwards Woodbridge, and his mother's maiden name was Catherine Starkweather.

He was born in Brookline, Massachusetts, June 30th, 1844, and when still a child united with the church of which his father was the pastor. He was ready to enter Williams College when in 1861 the call of his country led him, a lad of seventeen, into active service. He enlisted in an Arkansas cavalry regiment, and for a time was Provost Marshal, an especially difficult position for so young a man. After nearly three years service he left the army a First Lieutenant.

Returning to Boston he entered civil life as clerk in a Returning to boston to go west and to the new bank, but in 1870 he decided to go west and to the new bank, but in 1870 he does Lake Superior. He also in which he was the mean with his other business established the Lake Superior News, a weekly paper of which he was both proprietor and editor, and which enjoyed the distinction of being the best weekly newspaper in the State. The weekly finally developed into the Daily News which by consolidation with the Tribune became our morning News Tribune.

Mr. Woodbridge was always a prominent figure in the community but especially is this true with reference to all religious work, and in this work, whether among the veterans of the Grand Army Post, of which during the last year of his life he was Commander, or in his church, or in the Young Men's Christian Association, where he was a director from its

inception, he was an acknowledged leader.

He was prominent in the movement which led to the organization of Pilgrim Church in 1871, being one of the original sixteen members and a deacon continuously from the beginning. We who have been associated with him in church fellowship have learned to know something of his love for this church and its welfare a love that may well be called the ruling passion of his life. But his horizon was not bounded by the narrow limits of his own church, for to him was given the wider vision which took in the broad field of God's work in all the world.

In February, accompanied by Mrs. Woodbridge, he went to California for his customary winter vacation and to seek a renewal of his health which for some years had been somewhat impaired. In Los Angeles he was obliged to go to the hospital, where on Friday, March 24, he passed away after a

An abiding trust in the goodness of God which sustained him in life did not fail him in the hour of his death. As he neared the end, and his body was torn with suffering, which at times seemed greater than he could bear, he turned to the promises of the Master with the faith of a child. He found supreme comfort in the words of Christ, "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be

Sustained and soothed by such words as these our friend drifted out of this life into the life beyond. Surely to him drifted out or tuns in.

Thirty-fourth Annual Meeting of the Minnesota Branch of the M. B. M. I.

Those of us to whom the privilege has been given of attending the 34th annual meeting of the Minnesota Branch, have received an inspiration and an enthusiasm which though it will be difficult to impart in its fullness, will, we hope, result in more

active service. Miss Evans, in the opening devotional hour, spoke of the five bequests which Christ made to us in His last Will and Testament: The privilege of prayer in His name, the Holy Spirit, His own companionship, Peace, and last of all, Work. But the work which he left us to do is not just work in the sense of activity and energy in behalf of His kingdom-but the work which is an interpretation of the spirit of God within us.

Miss Nason, too, emphasized the fact that we should not think of our work as merely the preparation of interesting programs, the increase of our membership or the raising of our apportionment but of the transmutation of all these things into

This thought has been uppermost in all of the sessions. "The transforming of love, the emotion, into love, the motive."

It is impossible in a short calendar notice to mention even the best things we have heard; but perhaps the most abiding impression is of the presentation of the Medical Missionaries' work in China by Dr. Emma Boose Tucker. Dr. Tucker's personality wins attention at once. Her face reflects the life of the spirit and one feels in her presence, the force of the truth, "The fruit of the spirit is love." Dr. Tucker vivified to us the vastness of the population of China by saying that every third child born in the world is a Chinaman. She pointed out that the most important element in the awakening of the New China is its educational awakening and the best feature in connection with missions in China is the union of all denominations in the work of the higher schools.

The vital and responsible position of the medical missionary was made very clear to us as Dr. Tucker described to us the tours from village to village when often 300 patients have been treated and seven operations performed in one day, and of the work of the hospitals where one-third of the cases were eye cases and where 3,500 operations have been performed in one week. Dr. Tucker asked our prayers that the physicians might never become too weary during this ministration to the body to give out spiritual help as well.

At present there is only one physician to every 250,000 people in China and they have all the ills the flesh is heir to and some more besides. We shall never forget the graphic picture presented to us by this speaker of her own illness with her new born baby by her side at a time when cholera, scarlet fever and whooping cough were raging in the compound; of the absolute impossibility of observing quarantine because of lack of roomand then with tears in her eyes she spoke of the danger of the children of our workers on the field under such conditions. "Oh!" she exclaimed, "It is not right. We know it is not right."

This is only one of the many appeals that have come to us and our souls have been stirred as never before to a sense of our own share in the responsibility for the welfare of our missionaries and for the spreading of Christian methods and Christian ideals throughout the whole world.



Thirty-ninth Annual Meeting of the Minnesota W. H. M. N. The 39th Annual Meeting of the Minnesota W. H. M. U. was held in Plymouth Church, Minneapolis, April 20th and 21st. The new president is Mrs. Tupper, a sister of Miss Emily

Hartwell of the Foochow, China, Mission. Mrs. Howard Murray Jones presided at the sessions and the programs were varied and interesting. Perhaps the most note worthy address was that delivered by Mrs. Ida Vose Woodbury, worthy address who was introduced as the "best man in the A. M. A." Mrs. Who was the word word word word word word was the woodbury is probably the most eloquent woman speaker in America today. Her oratory, her diction and her rapidity of speech all remind one of Phillips Brooks. She spoke of the five speech an representative American figures, the Puritan Ancestor, the Revolutionary Soldier, the Abolitionist Father, the Boy in Blue and last of all, the Missionary. This last figure she considered the greatest of all for "It is greater to make men worthy of liberty than to make them free."

She spoke of the work for which the A. M. A. stands as the most vital, the most necessary, the most far-reaching and the most widespread of any work in the world. Emphasis was laid upon the thought that God had chosen America as an exponent of His Spirit and that America was now being tested. Many instances were given of discrimination against the negroes, illustrated by stories, some of which led us to the verge of tears and others creating merriment, tinged always with sympathy. The mission to the Mountain Whites was made to seem very much worth while when we heard that the new generations of Turners and Howards are no longer at feud, but are now attending our schools together, one of them being president of the Christian Endeavor Society. One of the older Turners who led the last feud is now a strong supporter of Mission Work in Harlan county, Ky., made famous by the deadly Howard-Turner

Mrs. Woodbury spoke, too, of Alaska, saying that we bought the people there for 2 cents an acre and that the salpon last year paid three millions more than we paid for the whole territory. There are few workers in this field, but the results are manifold. One mission there reports a Sunday School of 300 and an attendance at prayer meeting, at a time when the thermometer registered 40 below, of 186. The speaker suggested that it might be wise to move our home churches to a colder

The work among the Indians was also touched upon. In the Santee agency the Indians have increased their membership at the rate of 75% while the Congregational whites of America have increased 2%. They have given an average of \$9.00 apiece while the whites have averaged \$2,55.

Other phases of our home mission work were mentioned by other speakers, notably the training, in the Schauffler School, of young women who go out into Slavic communities to break down race prejudice; and the schools for Christian education in New

The sessions closed with a forceful address by Dr. Cyrus Northrup, the president of the A. M. A.

The next meeting of the Union will be held at Glencoe in April, 1912, and at least two months before that time a new constitution is to be presented to all auxiliaries for ratification.

A Comparison

The Congregational Year Book for 1911 came last week. It gives the statistics of the Churches up to January first. The benevolent contributions are reported by the treasurers of our national societies. The following figures have been selected from the Minnesota reports. The Churches named are those with which Pilgrim would be classed in standing and number of members. The Church at Winona is not included because the figures from that Church are incomplete.

It is interesting to note that only two Churches in the state are ahead of our Church in regard to benevolent contributions. in proportion to membership, Plymouth and Lowry Hill at Minneapolis. Plymouth, which heads the list, sold their down town property a few years ago for \$250,000, and with the proceeds erected a beautiful Church, having every convenience, in a most favorable location. As a sort of thank offering for this splendid edifice, which cost them nothing, the people of Plymouth largely increased their missionary contributions. Almost without exception these Churches are located in residential districts, and have little or nothing of the backward and downward pull of the down town situation. Lowry Hill, Minneapolis, is in the finest residence section of the city.

It ought to encourage us to know that we compare so favorably with these our peers.



The Congregationalists of America are pledged to a work The Congress and benevolences aggregating two million dollars. for missions and dollars is apportioned to the states, and by the state societies to the churches. Minnesota's share is \$50,000 and \$1,350 of this is to be raised by Duluth Pilgrim Church*. and $\mathfrak{F}_{1,000}$ of the amount raised by each church goes to the woman's organizations (15% to the Foreign and 15% to the Home Board).

The Woman's Boards, which are engaged in the foreign field, co-operate with the American Board, but they are doing an independent work chiefly in the conducting of schools for women and young children. In the 50 years of their elistence they have contributed nearly eight million dollars to this work.

Minnesota women share in this work by supporting seven missionaries and thirteen native teachers and their school expenses are \$7,500, exactly 15% of the \$50,000. The salaries of these workers remain unpaid if the church apportionments are not fully met. No other organization stands ready to do this work which is specifically for women and children.

The Minnesota Woman's organization for Home work is pledged to aid in the support of Rev. Pohammer of Grand Marais, the work among the Swedish-Finn miners in Biwabik, Rev. Howard's work in northern Minnesota, the Schauffler Training School for girls and other important work.

Pilgrim women, in conjunction with the younger missionary societites of the church are anxious to assist the church treasurer of benevolences in raising the \$1,350 which has been apportioned to us and have fixed as their aim the contributing of the 30% which will be used for the work which women are conducting.



S. S. "Pannonia."

July 29, 1911.

We have been thinking of you all many times since leaving My Dear Mr. Milne: Duluth and take this opportunity of saying so.

We had a most pleasant trip down the lakes and a fine visit in Ontario. We left there July 4 for Boston and New York. From there we went to West Virginia returning in time to sail on July 20 from New York. We have had a fine journey so far. Old Neptune seems to be in a genial mood and is not raising any disturbance. But he is such a fickle creature I'm almost afraid to say so much in his praise.

We hope to reach Gibraltar on Sunday some time, probably in the evening. Although ticketed to Naples, we may not disembark there. The cholera is so bad there that some ports are enforcing quarantine regulations against it. To sail from there to Constantinople would mean quarantine for us I'm afraid, so we have been thinking it would be better to stay aboard this boat until we reach Trieste and take an Austrian Lloyd steamer from there to Constantinople. However, when we reach Gibraltar we shall learn what's best to do.

The children, Mrs. Irwin and myself are well and remember with gratitude all the kindness we received while at Duluth. Hoping you are all well and with kindest regards to Mrs. Milne, Marjorie and all friends, I remain,



The meeting is called for the purpose of ascertaining just what can be done by the various organizations for relief of the destitute during the coming winter and to enable that body, which is the central and coordinating unit, to map out its campaign of work. Last winter a tentative plan of districting the city among the societies and churches was adopted and it is to perfect this plan and make what modifications and changes may seen necessary that the meeting is called. Just what field can be covered to advantage and what means the different societies can command, if called upon, will be ascertained, and the information secured will be availed of to facilitate the work of the board in the city.

The title of Dr. Patton's stereopticon address next Thursday evening will be "Along African Trails," and it will describe a journey of over four thousand miles in the interior of Africa, including Gaza Land, Mashona Land, Matabele Land, Natal and Angola on the west coast. Certain parts of the trip were in the nature of exploration of new territory with reference to studying the habits and status of the natives in the hope of eventually establishing mission stations among them. This applies particularly to Mashona Land between our station at Chikore and the Cape to Cairo railroad. The lecture will abound in descriptions and pictures illustrating the strange life of the natives. There will be shown views of the remarkable old ruins in Southern Rhodesia in the heart of the African Forest, which date back as far as King Solomon, and which indicate some long lost civilization. 



A Timely Message

For us to plead helplessness in such a day as this is pitiable indeed. Let us be strong in faith, full of enterprise, courageous, invincible. God has great things in store for us if we will but connect with him by faith. Pilgrim Church is a divine institution. God has shown you his favor, He has declared His leadership in the past.
