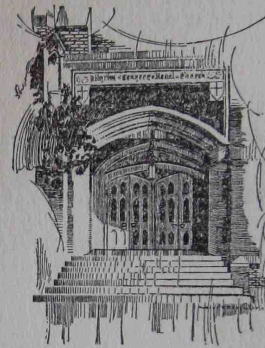

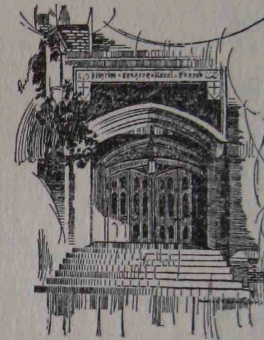
### MEMBERSHIP IN PILGRIM CHURCH

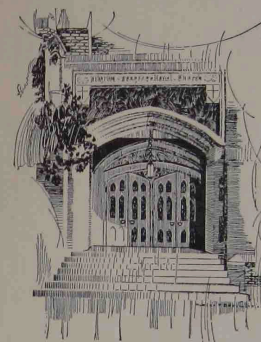
#### THIS CHURCH BUILDING

## TEN DIMES IN TEN WEEKS

The "Dollar Plan" proposes that each individual connected with the Congregational Churches be asked to contribute an extra dollar this spring that the work of our State Conferences and Home and Foreign Boards need not be so badly crippled by the pressure of hard times. In 1931 the regular receipts fell off \$459,000; some similar shrinkage will be inevitable in 1932. The "extra dollars" will help to counteract the result of this decrease. 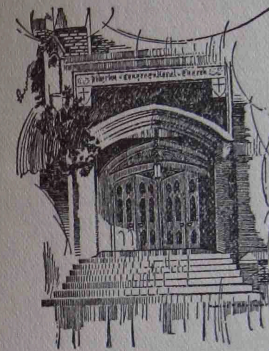
#### THIS CHURCH BUILDING
