A Word from Dean Brown on the Debt of Honor

There is a group of about 1,400 ministers and widows in our Congregational and Christian Churches which has a unique claim on our loyalty. They are the survivors of those who became members of the Original Annuity Plan of the church, which closed its rolls at the end of 1921.

Now old age is swiftly closing in on this group. The number of annuitants is rapidly increasing. They have counted on the payment of their annuities. In many cases it is their only resource - something not remarkable when we consider that the average annual salary of our ministers last year was only \$ 1,646.00. Today, payment in full of the modest annuities assured them by action of the General Council - a maximum of \$ 500.00 a year to a minister (generally married) and \$ 300.00 to a widow - is imperiled.

Why?

Because the share of the Annuity Fund in Church missionary contributions for the last fifteen years has not been sufficient to meet the church responsibility for the deferred wage of this group of aging ministers. The time has come when our great denomination must make an heroic effort to repair its neglect.

It is a DEBT OF HONOR on the part of the Congregational and Christian Churches.
It is a DEBT OF HONOR owed to the valiant ministers of the Church of Christ.

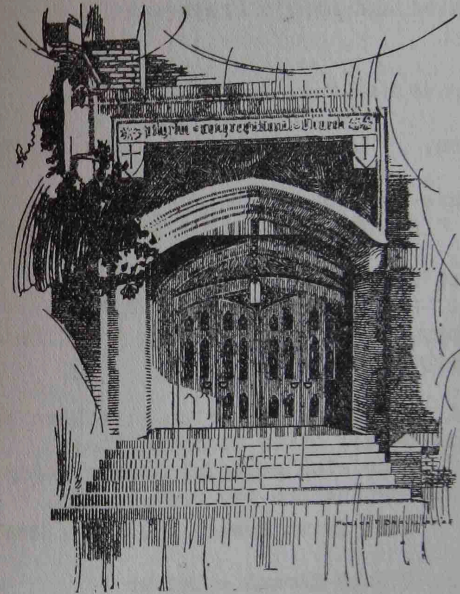

A Challenge

At the State Conference this past week the delegates learned two facts which ought to challenge them and all of us.

The first fact is that there are nearly 500,000 children in Minnesota without any regular religious instruction.

The second fact is that the enrollments of our Church Schools have declined at an astounding rate. This fact is brought out in the following Chart.

Decline in Church School Enrollment since 1928:

CONGREGATIONALIST	30%
METHODIST	20%
PRESBYTERIAN	12%
BAPTIST	0%

Our decline of 30% represents a loss of 1,000 children per year for ten years.

The main cause for this decline according to those who ought to know is SPIRITUAL INERTIA.

Pilgrim Church has been making plans to do something about this situation. Next year each department of the Church School will have its own supervisor. These supervisors will go to Faribault in July where they will have two weeks of intensive training in their particular departments in the Summer School of Christian Education.

We are also hoping for a closer co-operation between parents and the teachers and officers of the School that we may effectively meet our share of this problem next year.

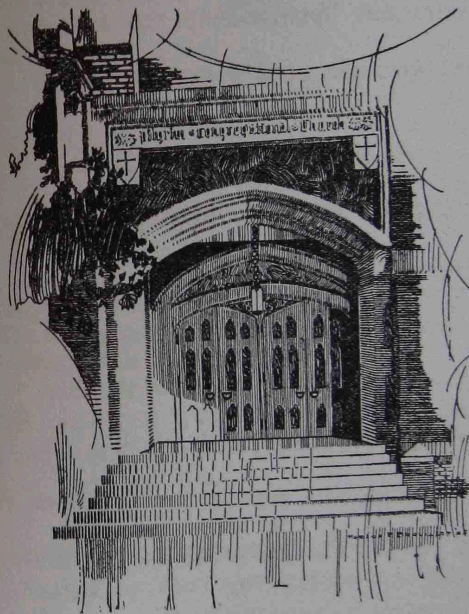

Perhaps you have been looking for some certain piece of glass, jewelry, table decoration or bric-a-brac - you probably will find it at the White Elephant booth.

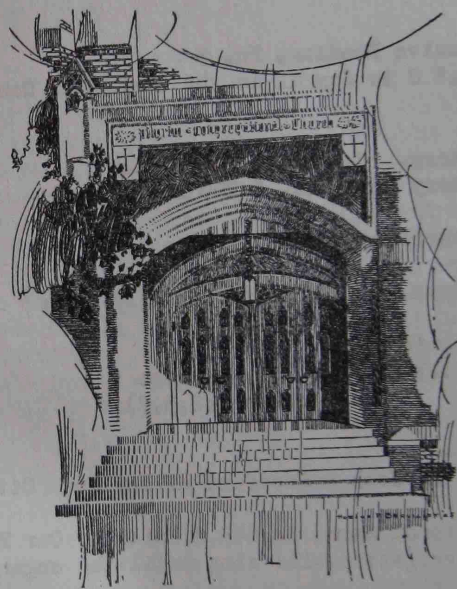

A Victory Dinner for the whole parish at 6:30 p.m. A full report of the Canvass will be made, so that every member may know just what our financial prospects are for the coming year.

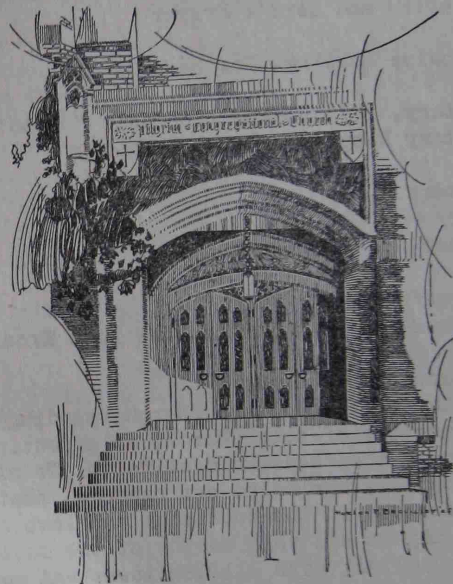

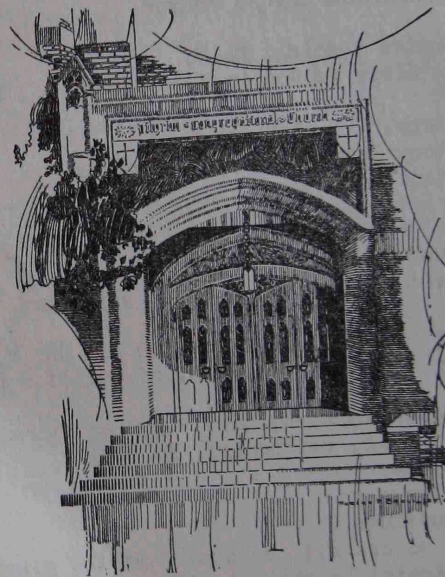

Boy Scout News

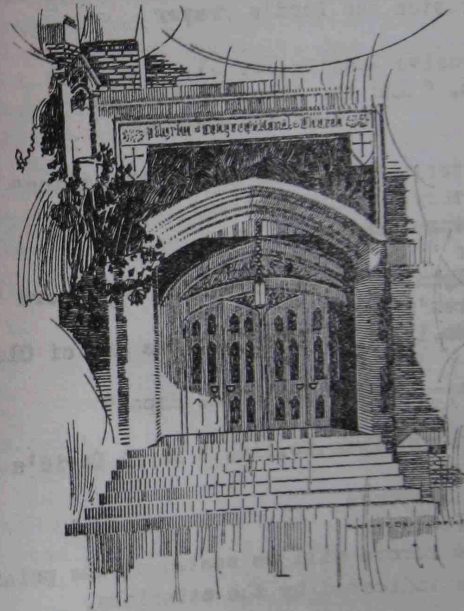

and Jack.

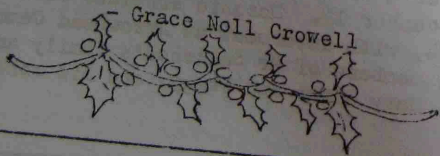
