MORBUS SABBATICUS - Morbus Sabbaticus is a disease peculiar to Church membership: 1. The symptoms vary, but it never interfers with the appetite. 2. It never lasts more than tenty-four hours. 3. No physician is ever called. 4. It always proves fatal in the end - to the soul, 5. It is contagious.

The attack comes on suddenly every Sunday; no symptoms are felt on Saturday night, and the patient awakes as usual, feeling fine; eats a hearty breakfast. About nine o'clock the attack comes on and last until around noon. In the afternoon the patient is much improved and is able to take a rife and read the Sunday papers. Patient is able to go to work on Monday morning, as usual.

Now old age is swiftly closing in on this group. The number of annuitants is rapidly increasing. They have counted on the payment of their annuities. In many cases it is their only resource - something not remarkable when we consider that the average annual

salary of our ministers last year was only \$ 1,646.00 Today, payment in full of the modest annuities assured them by action of the General Council - a maximum of \$ 500.00 a year to a minister (generally married) and \$ 300.00 to a widow - is imperiled.

Because the share of the Annuity Fund in Church missionary contributions for the last fifteen years has not been sufficient to meet the church responsibility for the deferred wage of this group of aging ministers. The time has come when our great denomination must make an heroic effort to repair its neg-



The first fact is that there are nearly 500,000 The first fact is that the children in Minnesota without any regular religious

The second fact is that the enrollments of our Church Schools have declined at an astounding rate. This fact is brought out in the following Chart. Decline in Church School Enrollment since 1928:

CONGREGationalist . Methodist Presbyterian Baptist Our decline of 30% represents a loss of 1,000 children per year for ten years.

The main cause for this decline according to those who ought to know is SPIRITUAL INERTIA.

Pilgrim Church has been making plans to do something about this situation. Next year each department of the Church School will have its own supervisor. These supervisors will go to Faribault in July where they will have two weeks of intensive training in their particular departments in the Summer School of Christian Education.

### ANTON C. WEISS 1863-1938

Anton C. Weiss was born at Sheboygan, Wisconsin, on September 20, 1863. In 1870 he moved with his parents to Redwood Falls, Minnesota. He spent his childhood, and received his education there. He came to Duluth in 1884 and continued his residence here from that time. On October 5, 1887, he and Miss Mary D. Sherwin were married. Mrs. Weiss united with Pilgrim Church, and Mr. Weiss, although not a member of the Church, attended with his wife and was one of the most loyal supporters of the program sponsored by the organization. Mr. Weiss was honored time and time again in his civic and business life and he was beloved by all who knew him. After a brief illness Mr. Weiss passed away on November 27. Services were held on November 29, with interment at Forest Hill. Surviving members of his family are his wife, a daughter and a son.




