Right now we need more members with regular church-going proclivities.

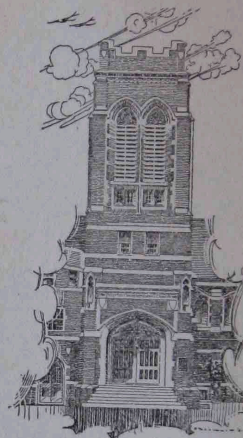
