We welcome all who worship here who are not members of this church. Since this is God's house and you are His child, you should feel perfectly at home.

The question is asked; "Is it correct to say St. James' Bible or the King James Bible?" The answer is King James. James the First of England assembled 450 scholars who worked for two years and nine months on the new translation. The King James version was first printed in 1611. Doctor Andrews who knew Hebrew, Chaldee, Syriac, Greek and Latin and ten other languages; Doctor Overall, professor of theology; Bedwell, the greatest Arabic scholar of Europe; Sir Henry Savile, the most learned layman of his time were four of the learned men who produced for us "The Authorized" or "King James" version. St. James had been dead for fifteen centuries when this Bible was first printed. (Please memorize this and help to lift the cultural level of our town).

This afternoon at four-thirty Miss Rogers and the choir spread before us one of the most delectable musical feasts of the year in their Christmas Vesper. The service will not exceed an hour, it will be all music, and all of it Christmas music. There will be no sermon and no collection. You can refresh your mind and warm your heart by coming.
