Our Covenant

We are united in striving to know the will of God as taught in the Holy Scriptures, and in our purpose to walk in the ways of the Lord made known or to be made known to us. We therefore join and covenant with each other to worship, work and serve together as loyal disciples of Jesus, to live among our fellow men a life of righteousness and brotherly love, and to do all within our power to promote the reign of God's will in all human relations.

The flowers this morning are given by Dr. and Mrs. C. M. Bagley in $_{\rm Melh}$ ory of Mr. Clarence J. Hartley.

The Annual Meeting last Wednesday was well attended and marked by the usual fine spirit of fellowship. The proposed Budget for 1960 totaling \$68,045 recommended by the Board of Trustees was adopted. This action was made possible by the magnificent response to the Loyalty Day campaign. Mr. Duncan reported that 466 pledges totaling \$62,020 had been received to put this campaign over the top. This was an increase of \$6,410 over pledges last year! These pledges along with anticipated income from loose offerings, the Women's Fellowship, Church School offerings, etc. assure us of the income to underwrite the budget.

It was also reported that the heavy expenses of the past year were all paid with a small balance of \$174 left in the General Fund, thanks to 11 extra gifts received at the close of the year, over and above pledges, totaling \$4,615.

The total cost of the building improvements and additions to equipment in the last two years was \$134,491. All these obligations were paid as due without borrowing. In addition, payments of \$28,558 were made on the church mortgage to reduce it to \$3,401 as of January 1, 1960. The balance of the mortgage is covered by outstanding pledges to the Building Fund.

Our giving for Benevolences has remained strong during this period of heavy investment in building improvements. In the last two years we have contributed \$28,062 to Benevolences.

New members received in 1959 totaled 56. Our loss by death was 14 and by letter of transfer 29. Total membership at present is 1,019, of which 834 are resident in Duluth.

Mimeographed copies of the reports presented at the meeting are on the tables in the Narthex and in the Vestibules. Please take one if you were unable to attend the meeting last Wednesday.

Next Sunday will be Youth Sunday. Mr. Bertsch will conduct the service and members of the Pilgrim Fellowship will participate in the service and tending part of the Minister's Week program at Chicago Theological Seminary. From there he will go on to the Midwinter Meetings of the Missions York.

New members will be received at the Communion Service on February 7. The basis of membership in Pilgrim Church is the acceptance of our Covenant. Ours is a liberal and free fellowship which seeks to emphasize the essentials of personal commitment without being dogmatic as to details.
