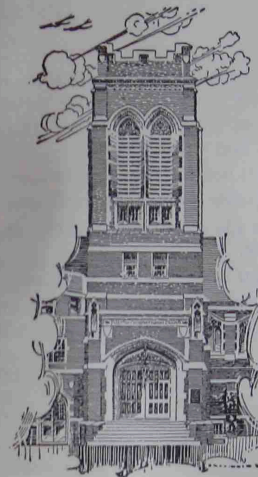

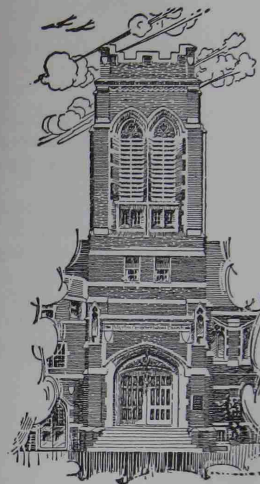

More Foster Homes are needed. The Foster Care Committee of the Duluth Welfare Council calls attention to the pressing need in our community to secure more foster homes for hundreds of children who, for one reason or another, have been deprived of proper family life. The committee has planned a meeting to be held at the Jewish Educational Center at 7:30 p.m. January 30 at which an informative film will be shown and a panel discussion, moderated by Miles Wangenstein, Director of St. Louis County Welfare Department, will explore the problem. All who are interested are invited to attend this meeting.

The Annual Meeting last Wednesday was attended by 170 members in spite of the cold weather. Dr. Elderkin was again with us to share in the meeting. A fine spirit dominated the meeting.

The reports indicated that 1961 had been a year filled with significant activities and achievements. The report of the treasurer indicated that the year had been closed with all bills paid and a balance of \$452 on hand. During the year the balance on the Church mortgage and the balance on the mortgage on the Third Street parsonage were paid in full. The Trustees reported excellent progress in the Loyalty Day campaign and expressed their appreciation to Mr. Douglas Walker for his leadership. To date pledges totaling \$61,092.98 have been received. This is \$660 more than had been received at this time last year.

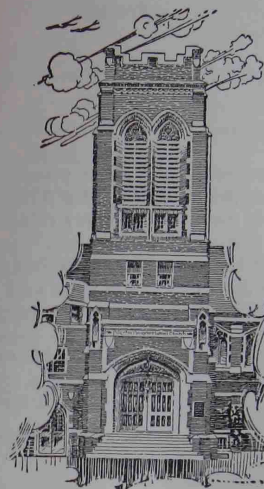

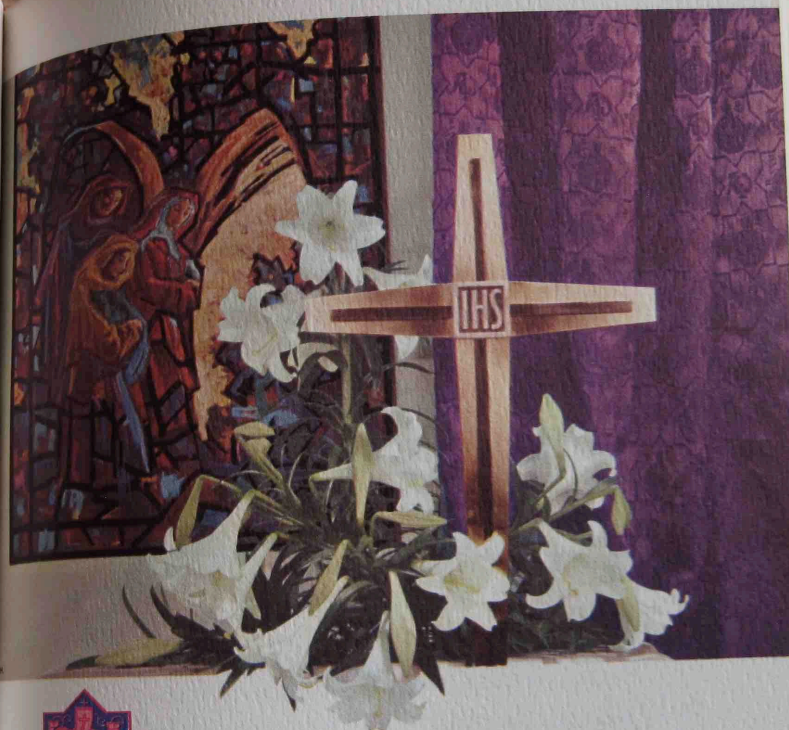
The Easter Offering will be divided between Northland College and the One Great Hour of Sharing program in which the major Protestant denominations work together to aid the needy overseas. Northland College will receive \$400 and the balance will go to One Great Hour of Sharing. Despite marked improvement in some areas, many millions of people are still uprooted, exiled, bewildered, despondent and bitter. Half the human family are permanently under-nourished. They never have enough to eat. This is a situation which evokes Christian compassion. It calls for more than words of pity. It calls for large scale effort, organized and carefully directed. Through the World Service Division of the Board for World Ministries the Congregational Churches participate in the far-flung ecumenical relief programs of Church World Service and the World Council of Churches Division of Interchurch Aid to Refugees. In this way we reach out in brotherly helpfulness to the ends of the earth and minister in ways that reveal the heart of the Gospel.

Maundy Thursday

The observance of the Holy Communion on the evening of Maundy Thursday is one of the most ancient of church customs. The word 'Maundy' is derived from the Latin *mandatum*, 'commandment', and has reference to the incident in the upper chamber when Jesus gave the 'new commandment': "Love one another, as I have loved you."

Since this 'new commandment' was given by Jesus after he washed the disciples' feet, the practice of a foot-washing rite on this day was early established and still survives in some localities and churches, twelve paupers being chosen as beneficiaries. In England the rite used to be performed by the sovereign to as many paupers as the sovereign was years old. James II was the last to observe this rite.

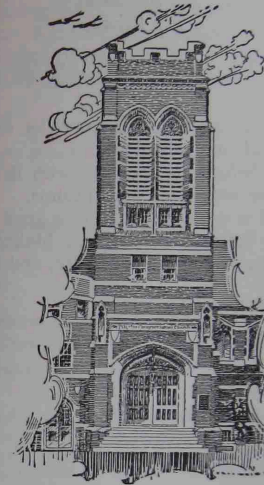

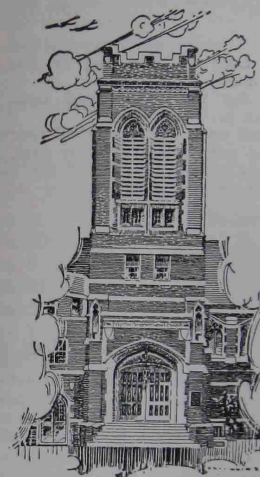

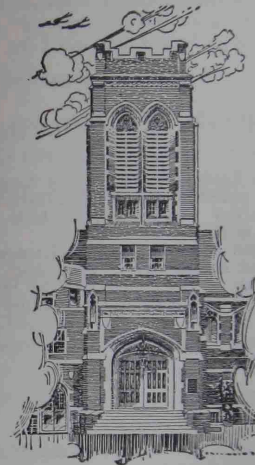
CHURCH AND COLLEGE — CREATIVE INTERACTION
