

MR. MAJOR'S SCHOOL AT CHIKORE

Macdonald Major, principal of Chikore Secondary School in Rhodesia, ha a big job on his hands. Some 330 students and 13 teachers look to him in a big job on his hands. Some as the seeks to provide a strong educational setting for Africant under Rhodesia's increasingly repressive rule.

The United Church Board for World Ministries helped open Chikora Secondary School in 1955. Until then there had been only a primary school which at that time enrolled 200 youngsters for eight years of education, and only a few secondary schools where children could go for further study

The Board gave a construction grant to help raise a dining hall, dormitory and staff houses. While there are still three missionary teachers on the staff more and more African teachers, some educated in Europe and the United States, are gradually taking their place.


English, literature, Latin, history, general science, arithmetic, mathematics geography, health science, Bible studies, Shona, and shop skills are being taught. The religious life of the community is led by both African and mis sionary ministers. Sunday morning discussions center on such topics as how to make church more meaningful to young people today.

A unique addition to the Chikore Mission is the Big Tree School which offers kindergarten and complete primary education for children of African and missionary teachers. It is the only recognized multi-racial primary school in the country.

February 8, 19

CONFRONTING THE ISSUES

Race Relations Sunday in the cool of February is a good time to plant to pl the word "confrontation" in perspective. In the heat of last spring's last summer's racial unrest, it was obvious that "confrontation" has do with people. People confronted people. Blacks confronted whites. whites confronted one another. But the passion of such confrontation sometimes obscured the underlying problems.

In the midst of last summer's unrest during the annual Race Relation Institute meeting in the quiet classrooms of Park-Johnson Hall on the tru shaded campus of Fisk University in Nashville, Tennessee, calmness p vailed. This was no oasis of unconcern. The discussions were intense. lectures, seminars and panels brought an exchange of widely varied view But the emphasis was not the confrontation of people, but the confrontation of issues. What were the issues? Basically there were two: the persis lack of equal opportunity in housing, education, and employment; and growing struggle to achieve power and pride by Black Americans, Span speaking and Indian Americans.


The participants of the Institute came from every part of the nation and resented both voluntary and governmental organizations. Among were teachers and students, clergymen and laymen of the United Ch of Christ, the United Presbyterian Church and many other denomination social workers and community organizers, labor leaders and businessman members of human relations committees and personnel from office agencies. Their purpose: to work together for a closer understanding the problems, processes, and methods of implementing better hum

CHRISTMAS IN MORIOKA

Last year, a group of young people in Morioka, Japan, decided that their Last year, a group or young people to share the real meaning of Christmas churches should sponsor a program to share the real meaning of Christmas with the predominantly non-Christian people of Morioka. They did not really know what they were getting into, reports United Church Board for World Ministries missionary Richard Lammers. Hearing of the youth's vision, the churchwomen decided to divert their energies from less-meaningful activities to strengthen the youth efforts. About 200 posters were placed around the city; 10,000 leaflets were passed out. On December 15th, about 300 people heard the Christmas message in song, Bible readings, and a sermon by a young pastor. Many went caroling with the choir which the youth had organized for the candlelight service. The churches in Morioka discovered through this "first-time event" new insights for reaching into the world. Naturally enough, our Morioka Christian brothers plan an even more extensive program this year.
