

Matthew 2:1-12

Who is it who was born in Bethlehem? Matthew sees Jesus as "king of the Jews" in David's line. Luke sees Jesus as "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." John sees Jesus as the cosmic Christ, one with God from the Gantiles." John sees Jesus for us? Like us, Jesus is a human, his feet set dawn of time. Who is Jesus for us? Like us, Jesus is a human, his feet set firmly in a particular time and place. Yet his teaching and life take root firmly in a particular time and place. He transcends space and time, brings across ages and national bounds. He transcends space and time, brings to our few years the overtones of eternity, and sets life on earth within the perspective of God's unbounded life.

A focus in many of Wallace Stevens' poems is the search for what he calls the "heraldic center of the universe." Each of us has her or his own search for meaning, a "centering" that we all do to find purpose, direction, significance in our lives—in our own perspectives on the universe. This essential human desire—to find unity in diversity—to observe the convergence of powers at work in the world—to center one's own experience—is captured and made sacred in the Christian celebration of Epiphany.

The manifestation of God to the Magi has several "centering" characteristics. First, the story focuses upon the communication to the Gentiles of the birth of Jesus, symbolic of a coming-together of cultures. Second, it depicts a visit of the very rich upon the very poor, a leveling of castes, an up-turning of values. Third, and perhaps most significant, it focuses upon the unity of nature and humanity. The birth of Jesus, a person, is communicated by means of a star, relating human values and experience to the way the world of nature works.

For the Christian, Jesus of Nazareth—his life, ministry, death, and life-giving spirit—is the heraldic center of the universe. Jesus is the Christ. In a special way we celebrate the Christhood of Jesus on Epiphany.



But in an age when secularity and doubt obscure the vision of God, we can make Epiphan a celebration of all times when God breaks into our hiding to manifes saving power.

ANOTHER ASPECT OF STEWARDSHIP







Historically, the Protestant Reformation was an instance of church renewal. Today, we understand this renewal more as a process than as an event, a process in which we ourselves can participate.




Reformation Day is also an ideal time to renew your own personal covenant with your Lord. Reformation Day can thus have both a corporate and an individual dimension.

Jericho's chief tax collector was up a tree. Rich and powerful he was. But compatriots hated him for being a traitor and a cutthroat. In their eyes his low morals matched his short legs. Then Jesus came to Jericho. The tax collector sought him and climbed a sycamore to catch sight of Jesus in the crowd. Now Jesus sought the tax collector, called him from his tree, shocked the crowd by going to his home, and answered his eager welcome with the gift of salvation. That day Zaccheus, Jericho's villain became a just and compassionate man.

SHARE THE GIFT

Most Christians are thankful for God's gift of Christ. In our churches we frequently recall that this Gift of Gifts has been shared with us and with all people. But how often do we think about how we ourselves are called by God to share the precious gift of Christ's presence with others who have not yet experienced it?

We share the gift when we use our time and our money in the service of Christ's church — both within our own community and beyond — through Our Christian World


We share the gift when we do something to improve the well-being of our world - its people and its natural

Remember God's covenant given to Noah, established in Abraham, confirmed in Israel, sealed in Christ, renewed with us. Remember loved ones who have died in the Lord and now inherit everlasting life. Remember the Ancient of Days who spans the generations: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob—us. Remember the sovereign purpose of God: there before creation, there over the horizon of all our years.

GIVE THANKS FOR THOSE WHO HAVE BROUGHT YOU FOOD

When you sit down to your Thanksgiving dinner this year, give thanks to God for the abundance with which your table is graced, and give a special thanks also for those who have produced your food.

Think of the farmers and ranchers, the products of whose labor you enjoy. Think also of the farm workers whose backbreaking labor has contributed to your abundance. And recall the peasant-farmers of other lands whose produce is set before you.

Do not forget the countless operators of granaries, workers in canneries, bakeries, and processing plants, the seamen and dockhands and truckers who have labored long to bring food to your table: the buyers and sellers, market managers and clerks who have helped along the way.


The church today stands beside them all as a reminder of the dignity of all who work the soil, all who tend the herds and flocks, all who process and transport the food we eat.

FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

NOVEMBER 27, 1977 MATTHEW 24:36-44

It is easy to mark off the days until Christmas: to mail greetings, set up a tree, wrap gifts, and get in supplies for the holidays. But "the coming of the Son" is not so manageable. A rabbinical saying goes, "Three things come unexpectedly: Messiah, the discovery of treasure, and a scorpion." Thus, the Advent cry: "Watch!" Interrupt the routine of existing. Listen to the ancient hope. Look beneath life's surface for signs of God's life. "Watch!"

ADVENT: TIME TO WAIT

You and I know people who just will not wait.

At a traffic light, they race the engine of a car, ready to charge forward the instant the signal changes — or the second before.

In a restaurant, they can't wait while a creative chef cooks a culinary treat. So, from the kitchens they get preportioned, pre-cooked, fast-frozen food, processed in Omaha, Atlanta, or Los Angeles, to be warmed-over and quick-served in Framingham, Fresno, or Fort Wayne.

Eager to cash in on the Christmas trade, stores hang plastic decorations and blare carols over loudspeakers as early as November 1.

Congregations begin to celebrate Christmas with nativity songs as soon as the strains of "Come, Ye Thankful People" die away. This early use of Christmas music robs Christmas Day of its freshness and profound joy.



How do we prepare "the way of the Lord?" 



MATTHEW 11:2-11

A little girl dies at Capernaum, and Jesus stops the dirge of funeral flutes by restoring her life. A woman hemorrhages for twelve years until, one day, she touches Jesus' robe, and the crimson flow is stanched of a new existence. Such deeds define Jesus' Messiahship. He comes, not with "unquenchable fire" but as the mediator of divine mercy. He is not an "axe laid at the root of the trees" but a physician who heals bodies and souls. He brings, not burdensome accusation, but liberation into a new life.

WHAT ARE WE DOING FOR THE HUNGRY?


In 1976, national agencies of the United Church of Christ spent approximately \$3.6 million on hunger-related programs and projects. Most of this (89%) was through the ongoing work of the United Church Boards for World and Homeland Ministries. The remainder was spent by other instrumentalities of the church and by the inter-agency World Hunger Working Group on a wide variety of special projects.

The Hunger Action Fund (HAF), which supplements what is done for hunger through Basic Support of Our Christian World Mission and through the all-church and special offerings, allocated grants totaling approximately \$70,000 in 1976 and another \$40,000 in 1977 to projects in constituency education and mobilization, public policy advocacy, aid and development, and theological and ethical studies. Some of these projects are sponsored by conferences of the United Church of Christ, others by our national agencies.

Whenever you are asked, "What is the United Church of answer, "Nearly one dollar of every five given to national work of the U.C.C. goes for hunger-related efforts."

MATTHEW 1:18-25

Distant mountains appear to dissolve in azure haze. Only when we are nearby do we see the ice and rock. So the Christ. The ancient anticipation and modern recollection of Jesus have often enveloped him in romantic mist. But to those nearby, Jesus brought a different experience. The expectation of his birth endangered the betrothal of Mary to Joseph. His career alienated his family. His teaching scandalized religious leaders. His Messiahship disappointed the disciples. Yet, in the birth of Jesus, God entered our history, to bring humankind a strong, strange, and sure salvation.

RESPOND—WITH EYES WIDE OPEN!

When you see what God has done in the world and learn the good news of God's mercy, the only adequate response is to give yourself to God's purpose. With eyes wide open—that's the way to respond to God!

Paul gives some straight-out advice to those whose eyes have caught the vision:

You want to preach? Then preach the big vision! You want to serve? Then make that your specialty! Or teach? Give it all you have!

Romans 12:6ff

While all of us are called to witness, pastors are uniquely called to the tasks of preaching, teaching, and serving. Because their eyes have been wide open to the vision, they have helped us to see it also.

Some ministers, who have thus served us in the past and who are now retired, have special needs. The Christmas Fund, received annually by the Pension Boards of the United Church of Christ, honors all these senior servants of the church and directly helps several hundred who need a special Christmas check. The Christmas Fund also provides year-round help to ministers and their families to meet emergencies beyond their resources.

The Christmas Fund gives us the opportunity to follow Paul's next words of advice: You want to give? Give freely! cheerfully!


