This overture to celebrate the arriving of Jesus among mortals is based on the famous Latin hymn associated with the first Sunday in the church year, Ven redemptor genitum. Martin Luther's German translation is depicted in this first section of the typical slow/fast/slow arrangement of a French Overture. The Messiah's arrival is a royal occasion, but is announced and fulfilled in a gentle way (by strings, and not by trumpets and drums). His descent to mortals is depicted by the movement downward of the choir sections: Sporano down to Bass. Together, the sections join in the second phrase of the hymn.

Open my heart to Jesus, He will come and enter there. Tho' I be dust and ashes, He will not forsake me; He will be delighted that I will be His dwelling place. Oh! how blessed will I be!

The sinister feeling portrayed in the bass solo gives way to the purest radiance and child-like devotion as the Soul (normally given as a solo to the soprano by Bach) welcomes exuberantly the entrance of Jesus to this world and to our heart.

Amen! Komm, du schone Freuden rone, bleib' nicht lange! peiner wart' ich mit

Amen! Come, You beautiful crown of joy, and please do not wait too long! I await Your arrival with great anticipation.

Bach reverts to a chorale verse to finish off the work. However, this portion of a chorale is from a hom most normally associated with the Epiphany sea-100 which comes after the Christmas season, (See last half of hymn 145.) The sopranos carry the melody in longer notes to the end, holding the word "Verlangen" for a very long time, while the strings climb to a pitch height near the end which Bach saves for only very special word painting situations. Here he perceives the Soul as winging its way, in joyful anticipation, to union and communion forever with the longawaited Messiah.

NOTES ON THE MUSIC

The Medieval Carol represents an interesting and The Medical and theooftentimes. You have heard two English Carols and a logical Pullancico, which is carol-like in format. The texts deal with the mystery that a person senses when faced with concepts not readily explained. Our nodern bent for reason tends to be absent and is replaced by a beautiful sense of drama and joy in the difts we are presented. This sense of drama is common to both the liturgical drama and the carol. The term "Macaronic" is used to describe the texts because of the mixed Latin-English usage.

Musically, the form tends to be burden (refrain), verse, burden, etc. The music materials remain but it is the text which changes in the verse. In these performances I have coupled textually related verses to shorten their length.

The instruments used are reproductions of early instruments. The instrumentation is speculative at best, for the concept of the composition including an exact orchestration, had not yet taken hold.

The offertory composition is from the final movements of a solo cantata composed by Telemann during the late (high) Baroque period. It was composed for the fourth Sunday in Advent. The scoring is Telemann's. The text of the cantata is from Philippines 4: 4-7.

The point of all of this is that a series of events occurred that baffle science. A beauty became a shared experience, a mystery was revealed. The ministry of this music will, I hope, help one regain that sense. To God's glory we offer our humble gifts.






