



### Central United Reformed Church Historical Notes

The Church came into existence on October 5th 1981 as a result of a union between two churches, Argyle and Trinity. Argyle had been a Congregational and Trinity a Presbyterian church but since the formation of the URC in 1972 there had been two churches of the same denomination in the centre of Bath.

During the preparations for union Argyle's minister was Revd JE Young and Trinity's Revd CJ Baker. Mr Baker responded to a call to Sutton in Ashfield and Mr Young guided the church for its first few months until his retirement. Revd MB Stolton then became Central's Minister from February 1983 until his retirement in January 1993. The present minister, Revd SM Henderson, was inducted into the pastorate in September 1993. Revd M Wheatley was appointed as Associate Minister in 1988 and retired in August 1994. Revd Mary E Piggott was appointed as Associate Minister in February 1996.

Argyle's history began about 1780 when a "dissenting party" separated from the Countess of Huntington's Chapel in Vineyards: Trinity had taken over the Vineyards chapel after the first World War, combining with the dwindling congregation using it at the time.

The Vineyards chapel with its attached house, built in 1765, was sold by the URC after the formation of Central to Bath Preservation Trust, which was anxious to undertake a thorough restoration of this historic building.

The building that is now Central was built by the dissenting party after holding services in a succession of places in the 1780's. It was opened for worship on October 4th 1789. The minister Revd Thomas Tuppen was too ill to lead the service and William Jay, a young preacher then at Bristol, was invited to preach the opening sermon. He so impressed the congregation that when Mr Tuppen died a short while after, Jay became the minister and his ministry of over 60 years is commemorated by a tablet on the front of the church. It was soon necessary to add galleries for a growing congregation and in 1821 the building was enlarged by extending south into what had been a forecourt. This south front was again rebuilt in 1862. Further alterations in 1887 included the present organ. The Grove Street Schools were erected in 1843 and, with the Percy Hall built in 1959 on the site of two condemned cottages, comprise the present Church Halls. ¶

# Central United Reformed Church - Procedures

#### 1. Members:

Central Church is a constituent part of the United Reformed Church in the United Kingdom, and is subject to the general procedures of that Church set out in the Scheme of Union, and any subsequent amendments and additions. Its Members shall be those who profess nembers shall be those who profess faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and covenant to share fully in the corporate life of the United Reformed Church.

#### 2. Membership:

Application for membership shall be made to either the Minister or Church Secretary. It is then the responsibility of the Minister and the Elders to be assured of the sincerity of the candidate's intention before taking his or her name to the Church Meeting for election upon nomination by an Elder.

After adequate preparation, and acceptance by the Church Meeting, candidates shall be publicly admitted to the full privileges and responsibilities of membership of the Church of Jesus Christ and in particular to the membership of the particular to the membership of the local church. This act shall be in accordance with the forms set out in the Scheme of Union (Schedule A).

Members of other Churches may be received into full membership by the vote of the Church Meeting, upon the presentation of a form of transfer or other satisfactory

The Elders shall also advise Church Meeting on the suspension of members and on the removal of names from the roll of members.

#### 3. Church Meeting:

Church Meeting shall normally be held monthly, and in any event not less than once a quarter. Special meetings may be called by the Minister and Elders, or by the Elders in the absence of a minister, or by written request to the Church Secretary of seven or more members of the Church giving one month's notice and specifying the business which it is intended to bring

#### 4. Election of Elders:

The number of Elders and their periods of service shall be decided by the Church Meeting. All members of 21 years of age and upwards shall be eligible for election providing they have been nominated by at least six members or have been nominated by the Elders' Meeting Each member of the church shall be entitled to make nominations in writing to the Secretary. All those eligible for election shall be informed and asked to state whether they would be willing to serve if elected. Voting shall be at a Church Meeting by secret ballot of those eligible to vote. Any member unable to be present at the Church Meeting may apply to the Secretary for a voting paper, and return it completed to the Secretary before the Church Meeting.

Those receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected, subject to the further condition that no member shall be deemed elected unless he or she receives a number of votes not less than one third of the number of valid voting papers returned. An election shall be held

even if the number willing to serve does not exceed the number of vacancies.

Each Elder shall be ordained on first election in accordance with the the forms set out in the Scheme of Union forms set out in the scheme of Official (Schedule B) and shall serve for the period decided by the Church Meeting. Elders re-elected shall be inducted to serve for the new term of office. Any casual vacancies in the Elders' Meeting may be filled by a member nominated by the Elders' Meeting and subject to confirmation by Church Meeting.

#### 5. Election of Officers:

As soon as possible after each election of Elders, Church Meeting shall on the nomination of the Elders' Meeting elect a Church Secretary and Treasurer and such other officers as may be required.

#### 6. Special Appeals:

Appeals for subscriptions for any objects shall not be made without the previous sanction of the Finance Committee. No expenditure which would fall on the general Church funds shall be incurred without the previous consent of the Treasurer.

#### 7. Statement of Accounts:

Each organisation connected with the Church shall during the three months ending January 31st of each year, prepare a statement of work done during the last completed year and send it, with a duly audited balance sheet, to the Treasurer for the information of the Finance Committee.

#### 8. Appointment of Minister:

A decision to call a minister shall be made at a Church Meeting specially made at a Church Meeting specially convened for that purpose, notice of such meeting having been given in writing to every resident Church member at least fourteen days previously. In no case shall the name of more than one minister be placed before the meeting. A vote of at least two-thirds of those present and eligible to vote shall be required in favour of the Minister nominated. The vote shall be by ballot papers distributed at the meeting

If the necessary vote is obtained the name of the minister shall be communicated to the District Council, without whose concurrence a minister shall not be called

#### 9. Alteration of Procedures:

Notice shall be given at a Church Meeting of any resolution for alteration of, or addition to, these procedures, such notice to specify the precise nature of the alterations The resolution shall be considered at the next Church Meeting and, whether amended or in its original form, must be submitted for confirmation or rejection at the following Church Meeting.



#### Church Finances

And now about the Collection . . (1 Cor. 16:1)

Central Church is self-supporting. Our main source of income is the direct giving of our members through the Offertories taken at morning and evening services.

These gifts provide for a full-time ministry, the running costs of our extensive premises and the full programme of church activities. We make a contribution to the URC for Ministry & Mission, the amount being assessed by the Province on the strength of our membership and our income. We also support many other Christian causes.

All this involves an annual expenditure at the present time of over £70,000 and towards this we invite each member of the church and congregation to make a personal assessment of what he or she can give. The majority of Church members make their offerings by means of the Weekly Envelope Scheme, which carries with it the moral obligation to give a fixed sum each week whether or not they are able to attend each Sunday. Some members prefer not to use envelopes, but rather to make their offerings by means of bankers order, or monthly or quarterly cheques. All means of giving are gratefully received.

Our annual income is substantially increased by contributors covenanting their gifts. This is a simple procedure by which an individual promises to give the church an annual amount for a

period of four years, and by so doing the church is able to reclaim the basic rate tax on the gift. With tax at 24% this means that the church can recover 32p for each £1 given. Thus an offering of £5 per week (£260 per year) when covenanted enables the church to receive £82 in tax rebate, making a total of £342 at no extra cost to the giver.

The value of covenanting is clear and we would urge all who pay income tax at the minimum rate to covenant their giving, both to the general offerings and to the annual Commitment for Life appeal. There is no need to worry about unexpected changes – the Inland Revenue rules allow us to release anyone from their covenant if unforeseen circumstances prevent them from keeping up their payments.

The Weekly Envelope Scheme and Tax Covenants are confidential to the Envelope and Covenant Secretary, Mr W Richardson, 36 Chaucer Road, Bath BA2 2EU (Tel 426991) and he will be pleased to give help and advice to all who wish to participate in either or both schemes. Good stewardship demands that we make the best use of our resources.

As with many churches and charities, we are also grateful for monies received by way of legacies. These amounts, regardless of their size, quite often help to fund major expenditures and are always exceedingly well received.
