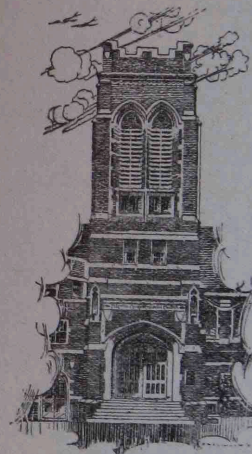

Good news. Sunday School opens next Sunday morning at 11 o'clock. Get the glad tidings to the boys and girls of the church and then get them here—Please!

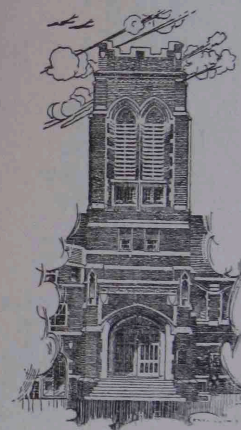
