

20th Anniversary Celebration of the Jaeckel Organ

November 9, 2008

Pilgrim Congregational Church Duluth, Minnesota

In May 1986, Pilgrim Church was blessed with a rich musical tradition but faced with a badly deteriorated

seventy-year-old organ. Recognizing its need for an instrument that would long retain its integrity for worship and recitals, the church contracted with Jaeckel, Inc. of Duluth to build a mechanical-action organ in the balcony of the sanctuary. Construction began in 1987 and the installation took place between October 1987 and May 1988. The organ was dedicated during the Sunday morning worship service on October 30, 1988 and the renowned French organist Marie-Claire Alain gave the inaugural recital on November 1,

From the first time our congregation heard the Jaeckel organ, we were awe-struck with the beauty of its sound and immediately grateful at how well it enhanced our worship. We still feel that way today, twenty years later. And, those twenty years have been busy ones. This exceptional, versatile instrument has led our hymn singing, accompanied our choir, pro-

vided celebration at weddings, and given solace during memorial services. We have also enjoyed countless concerts and recitals when accomplished organists from this region, across the United States, and abroad sat at its console. It is truly a magnificent instrument built by a master craftsman.



ABOUT OUR ORGAN:

- At the time of its installation, our organ was one of only two organs in this country which exhibited the highly stylized Classic (18th century) and Romantic (19th century) which exhibited the highly stylized Classic (18th century) and Romantic (19th century) are consistent organists and practices. This has allowed, and continues to allow. American organists an opportunity to experience the sounds which 18th and 19th century composers, organists, and organ builders had in mind when they were alive.
- The 1884 Aristide Cavaillé-Coll organ in the Abbaye Aux Hommes in Caen, France inspired much of our organ's design. Some aspects of the organ designed for Caen were modified in order to allow organists to successfully play the music of J.S. Bach and other composers.
- The organ is a mechanical-action organ (also known as a "tracker"). All the keys have mechanical linkages to the valves under the pipes, and the stops are controlled by mechanical linkages as well. The only electrical item in the organ is the blower. A mechanical-action was chosen (rather than electro-pneumatic or electric action) because of the longevity of this action. There are still playable mechanical-action organs that were built in the 16th century. Mechanical action is also preferred for musical reasons because it gives organists greater control over articulation.
- The organ makes use of ventil pedals rather than the traditional electric combination
 action. In other words, certain stops, normally mixtures, mutations, and reeds, may be
 drawn in advance, but will not sound until the ventil pedal for the particular division is
 depressed.
- One of the stops on the organ is the Rossignol (bird call) which imitates the warbling of birds. The stop consists of two small metal pipes whose ends are immersed in a vessel of water.
- It was unique to have an organ built from scratch locally. Because we are fortunate to have Dan Jaeckel here in Duluth, members of Pilgrim could visit his organ shop from time to time and visibly watch this instrument emerge. The organ builders who worked with Dan Jaeckel on this project were: David Rollin, Frank Mehle, John Thoennes, David Hanlon, Dean Hauge, Pete Macartney, Peter Pestalozzi, Hal Gober, and Warren Post.
- The "old" organ was built by the J.W. Steere & Son Organ Company and was located in the chancel area of the sanctuary. It was sold to the Irving Park Baptist Church of Chicago, IL. Three stops from this organ were used in the new organ.

- Many Pilgrim members, pastors, and staff helped support the building of Pilgrim's organ. Some key individuals include Ted Harwood who chaired the organ committee and Wally Niss who served as coordinator between church and builder during the building process.
- Jesse Eschbach (Professor of Organ at the University of North Texas, Denton, Texas
 and formerly on the faculty of the University of Minnesota Duluth) and Norma
 Stevlingson (Professor of Organ at the University of Wisconsin-Superior and former
 Pilgrim organist) served as co-consultants. Steve Morgan (former Pilgrim Music Director and Organist) was also highly involved during the planning stages.
- A major bequest from the estate of John Dalton was combined with other generous pledges and gifts to pay for our organ.
- A gift from Rev. Richard and Dorothy Nelson enabled Pilgrim Church to commission several new compositions to celebrate the installation of the new organ. One of these compositions was "The Small Passion" written by American composer Daniel Pinkham. The work was premiered by the Pilgrim Choir on March 19, 1989 and conducted by the composer.
- Pilgrim's organ has been played in concert by many outstanding organists including:
 Marie-Claire Alain, Jesse Eschbach, Norma Stevlingson, Gunther Fetz, Robert
 Glascow, David Craighead, Thomas Froelich, Clyde Holloway, Marie-Madeleine
 Duruflé, Robert Anderson, Stephen Hamilton, Richard Heschke, James Higdon, David
 Schraeder, Delbert Disselhorst, Martin James, Marie Louise Langlais, James Kibbie,
 James David Christie, Olivier Latry, and Thomas Trotter.
- Several organists have made compact disc recordings on our organ, including David Schrader, Janet Hunt and James Higdon.
- Our organ has been heard several times on "Pipedreams," a weekly national radio program that explores the art of the pipe organ. Michael Barone, host of "Pipedreams," has made recordings of recitals played on our organ.
- Pilgrim's organ was featured in the May 1991 issue of The American Organist (the American Guild of Organists' monthly magazine).


